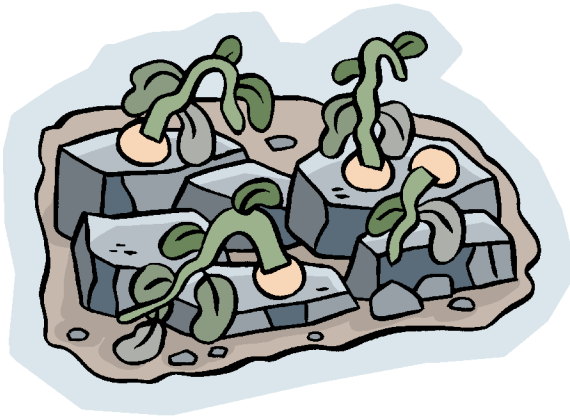
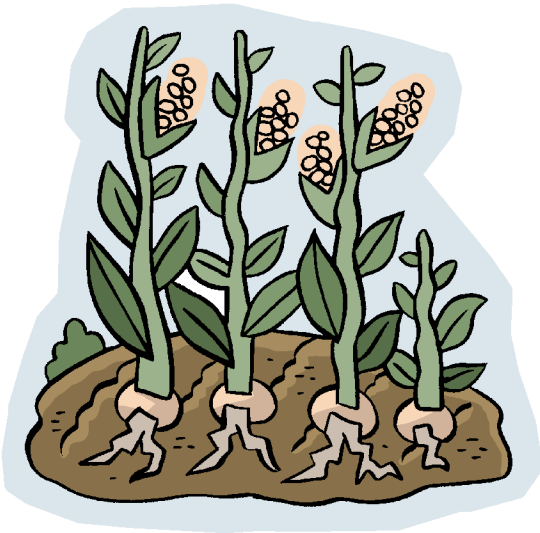
The Sower

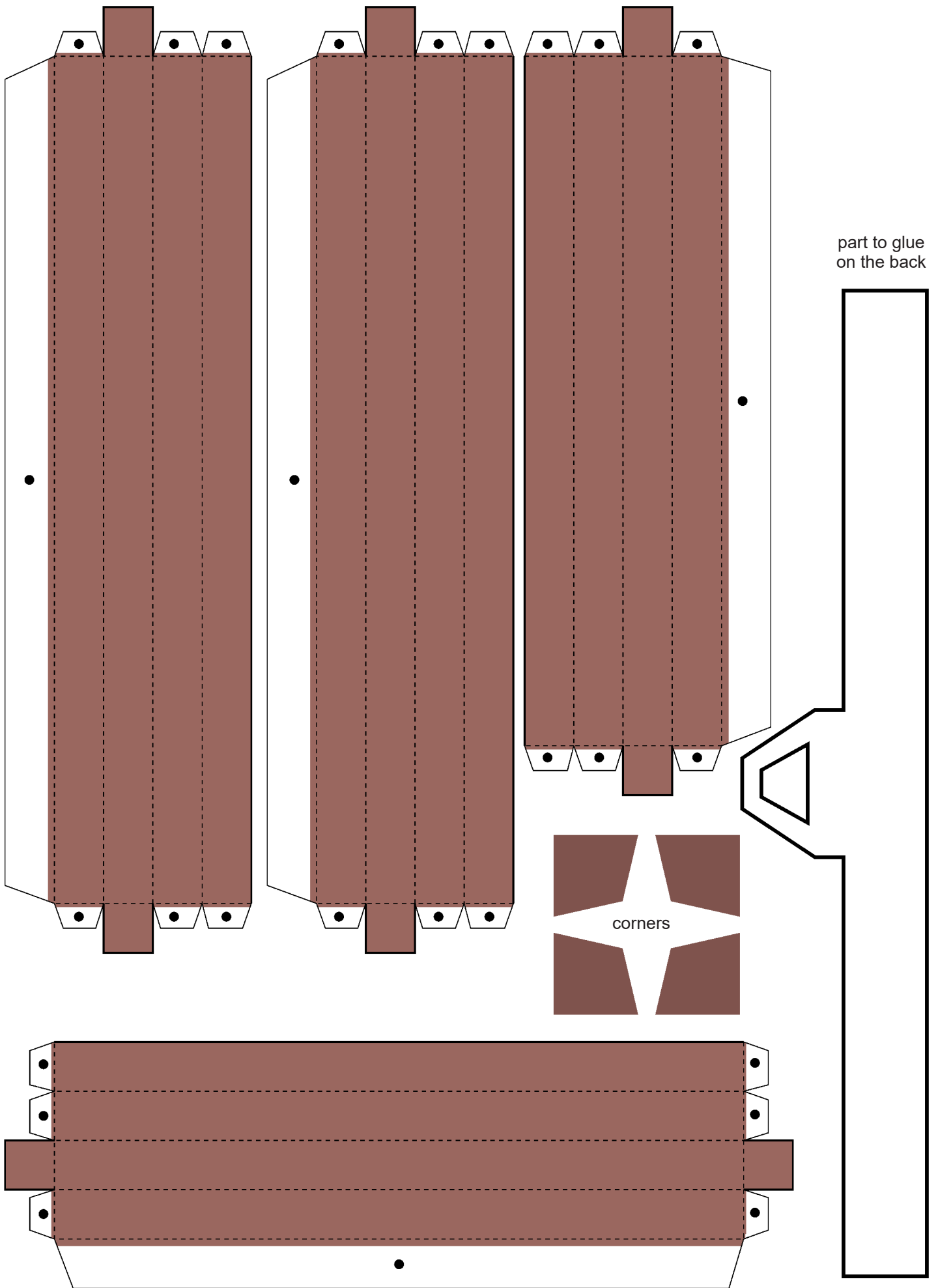
Based on Luke 8:5–15.

This parable can also be found in Matthew 13:1–23 and Mark 4:3–20.

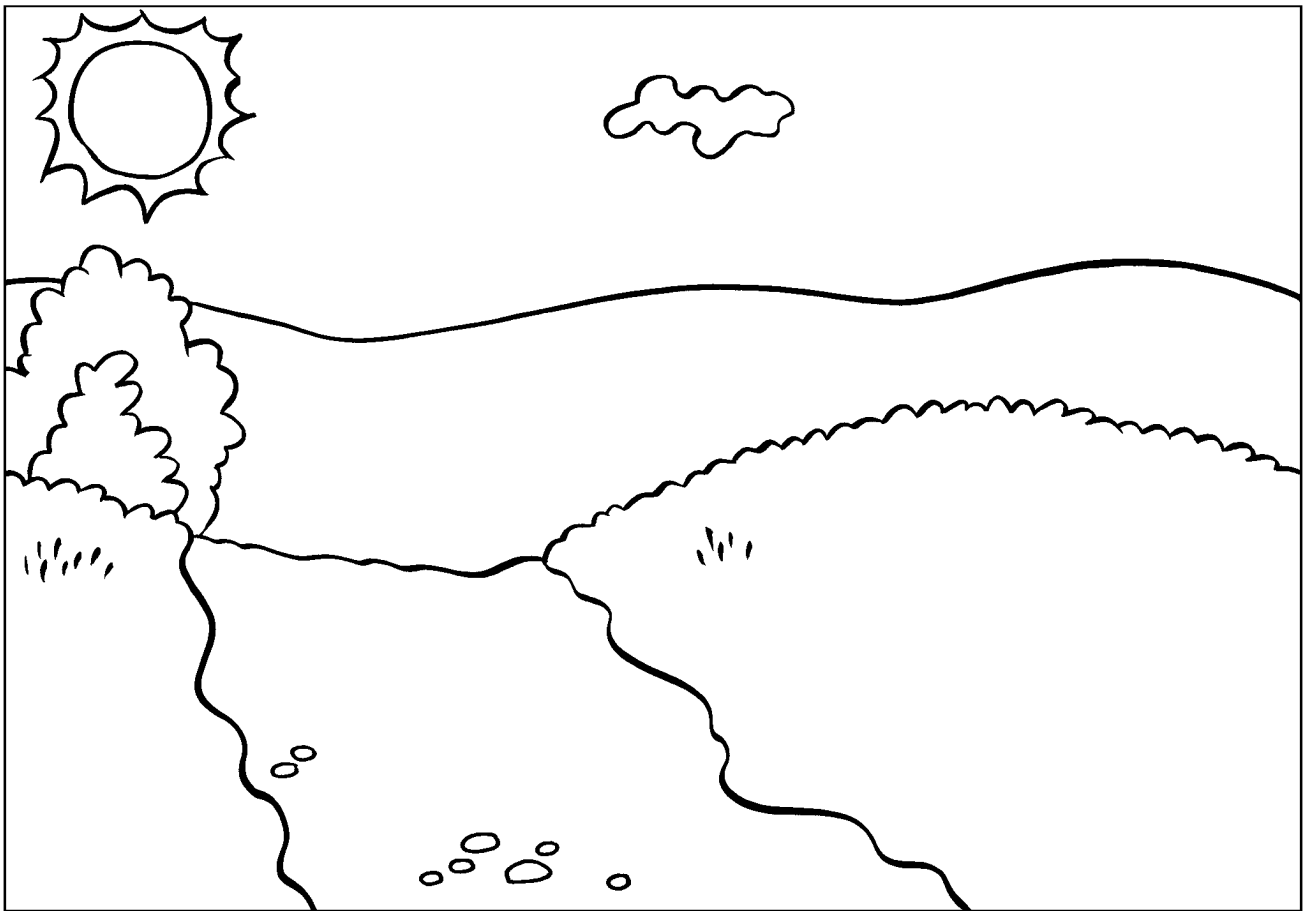
