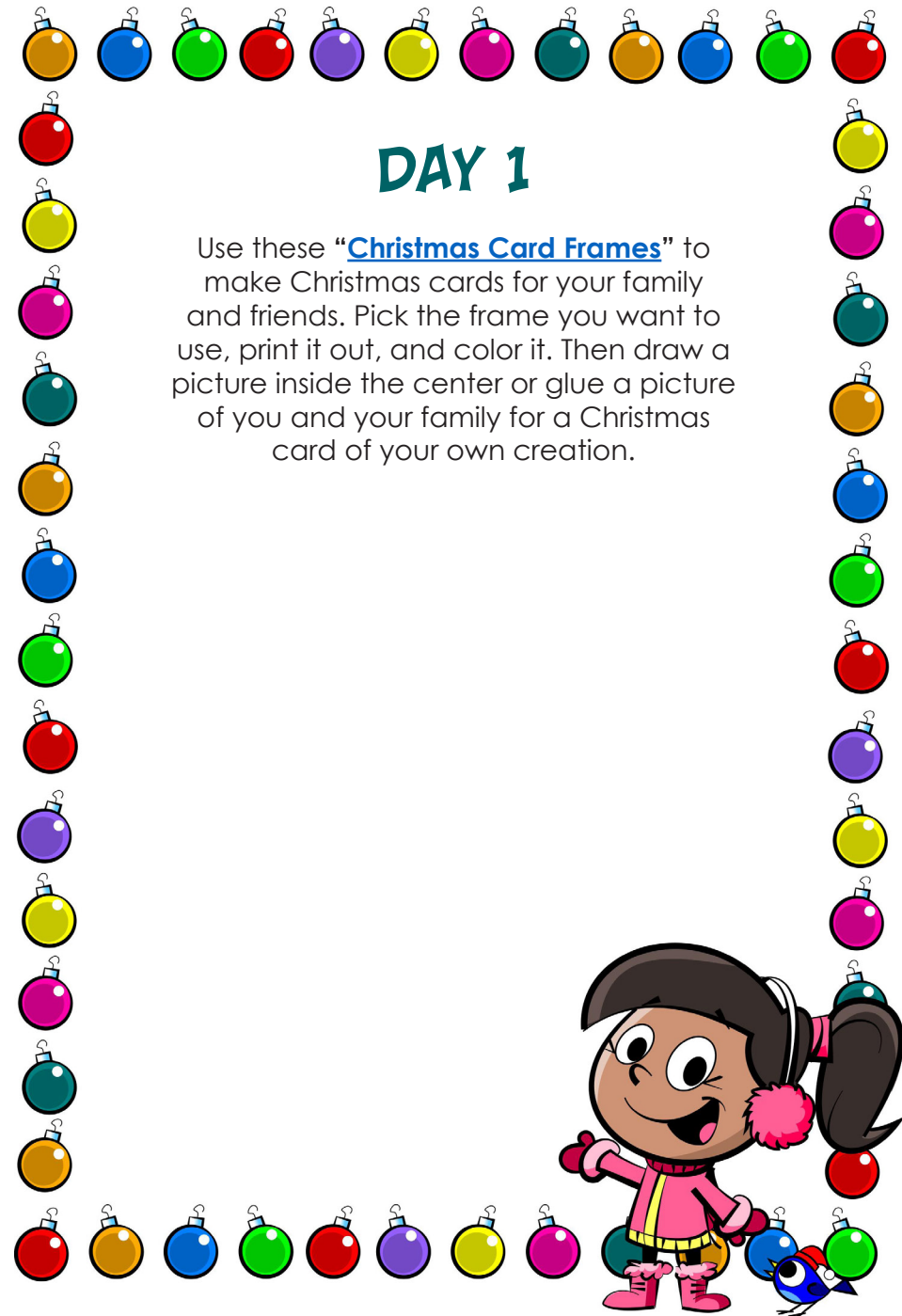


# 7 DAYS OF CHRISTMAS CHEER

**HAVE A JOY-FILLED CHRISTMAS!**

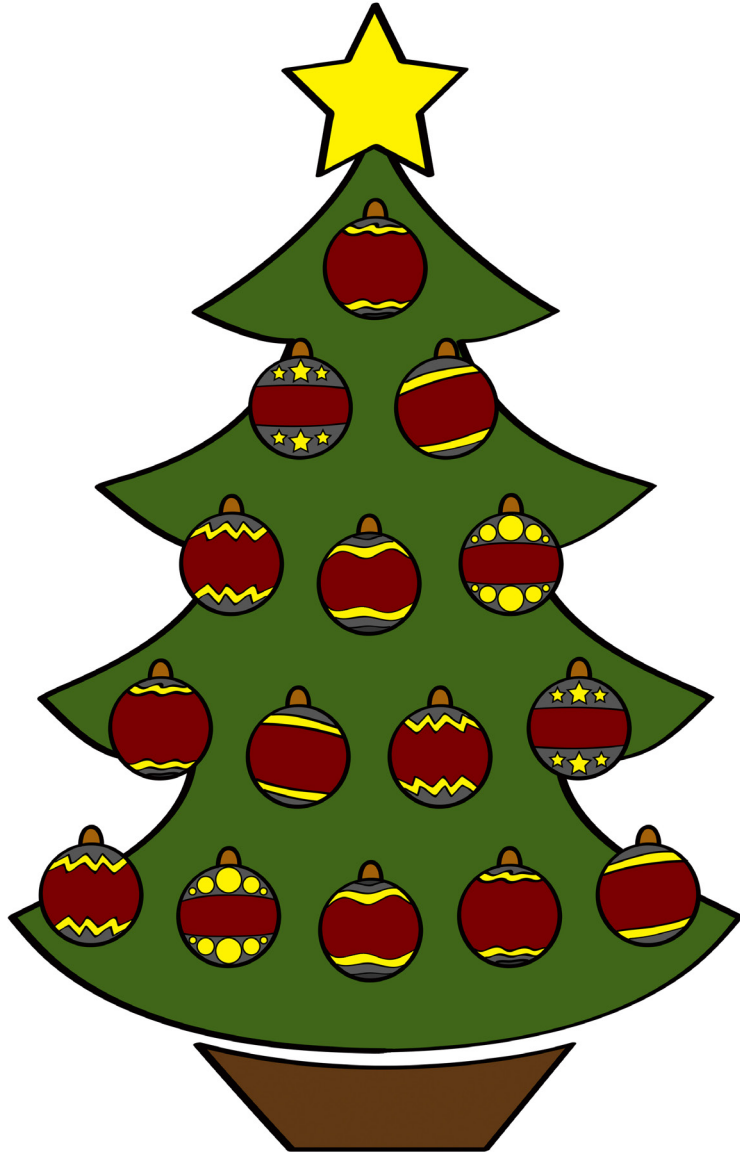


## DAY 1

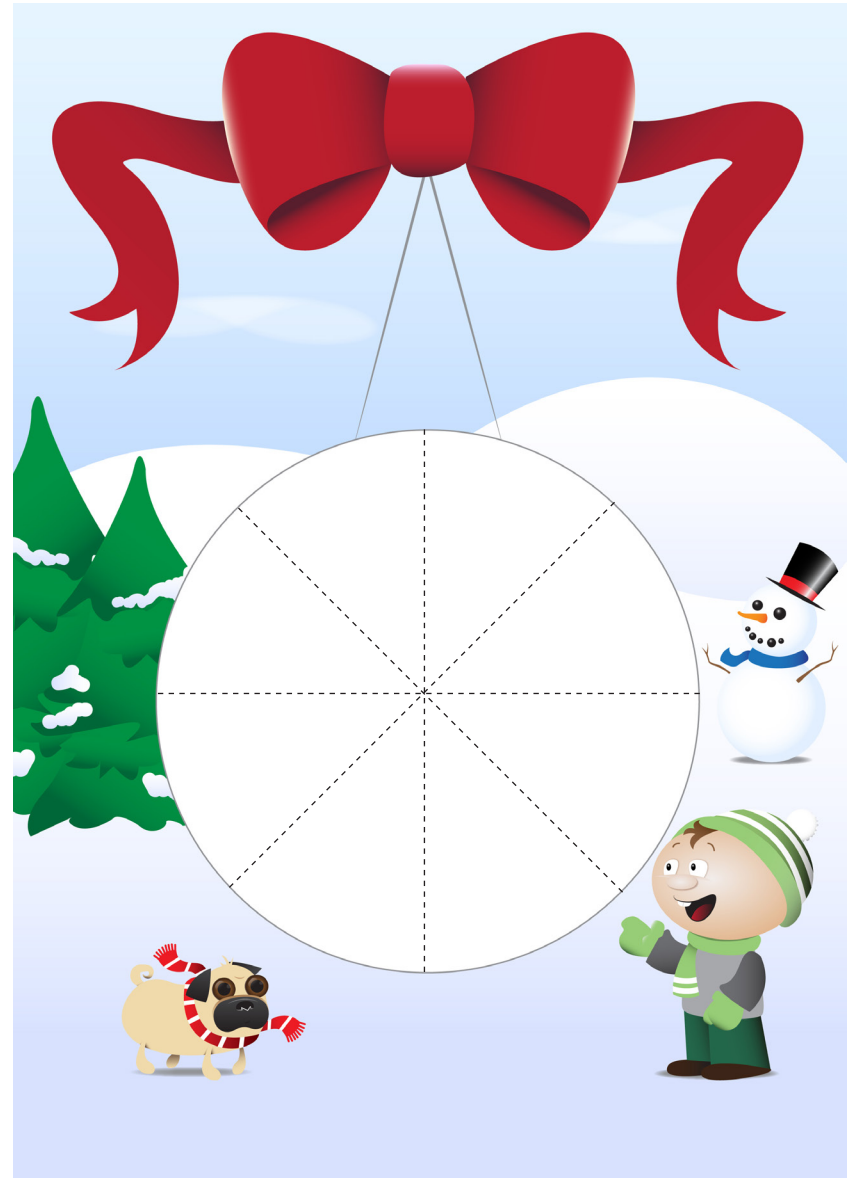
## DAY 2

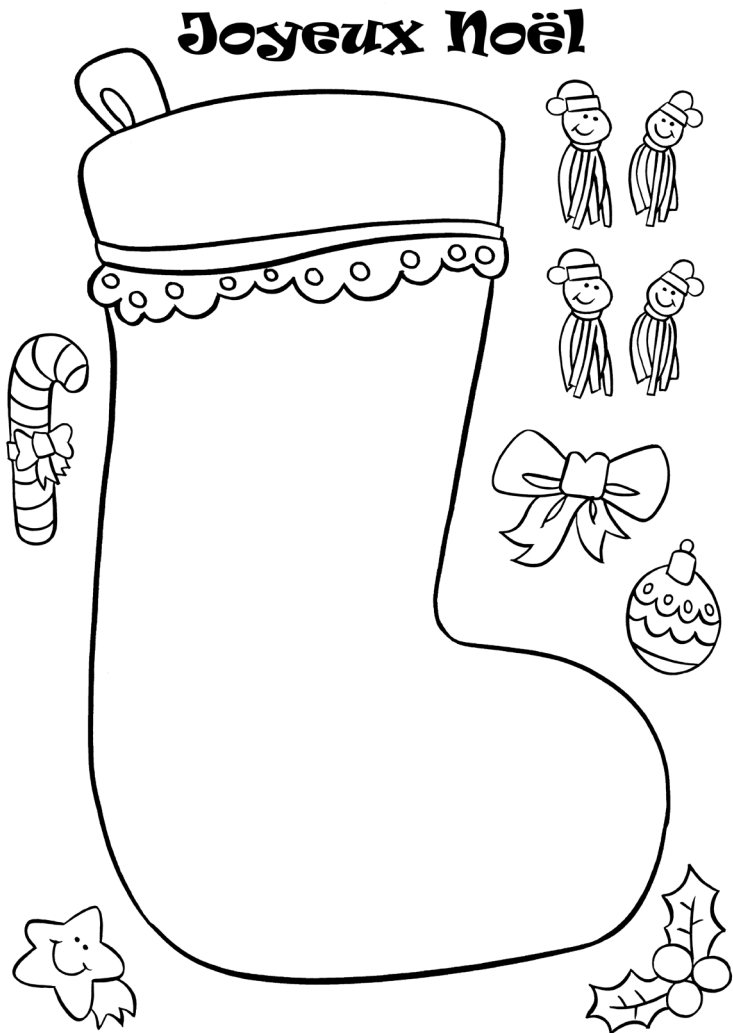
## DAY 3

## DAY 4

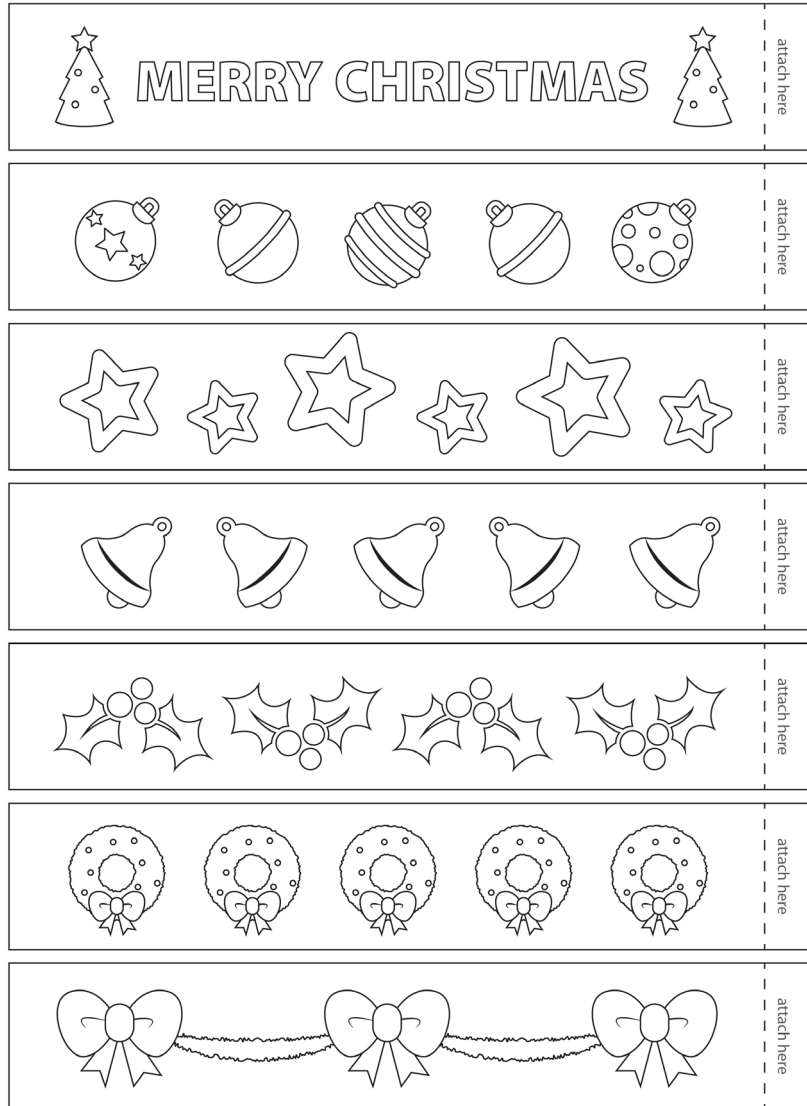
## DAY 5
