




God's Great Love for Us

God is probably upset at me and doesn't want to be near me because I stole Jim's car.




"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16 NKJV).


God planned for Jesus to give His life to pay for our sins, and then to be raised up from the dead and to live again.
