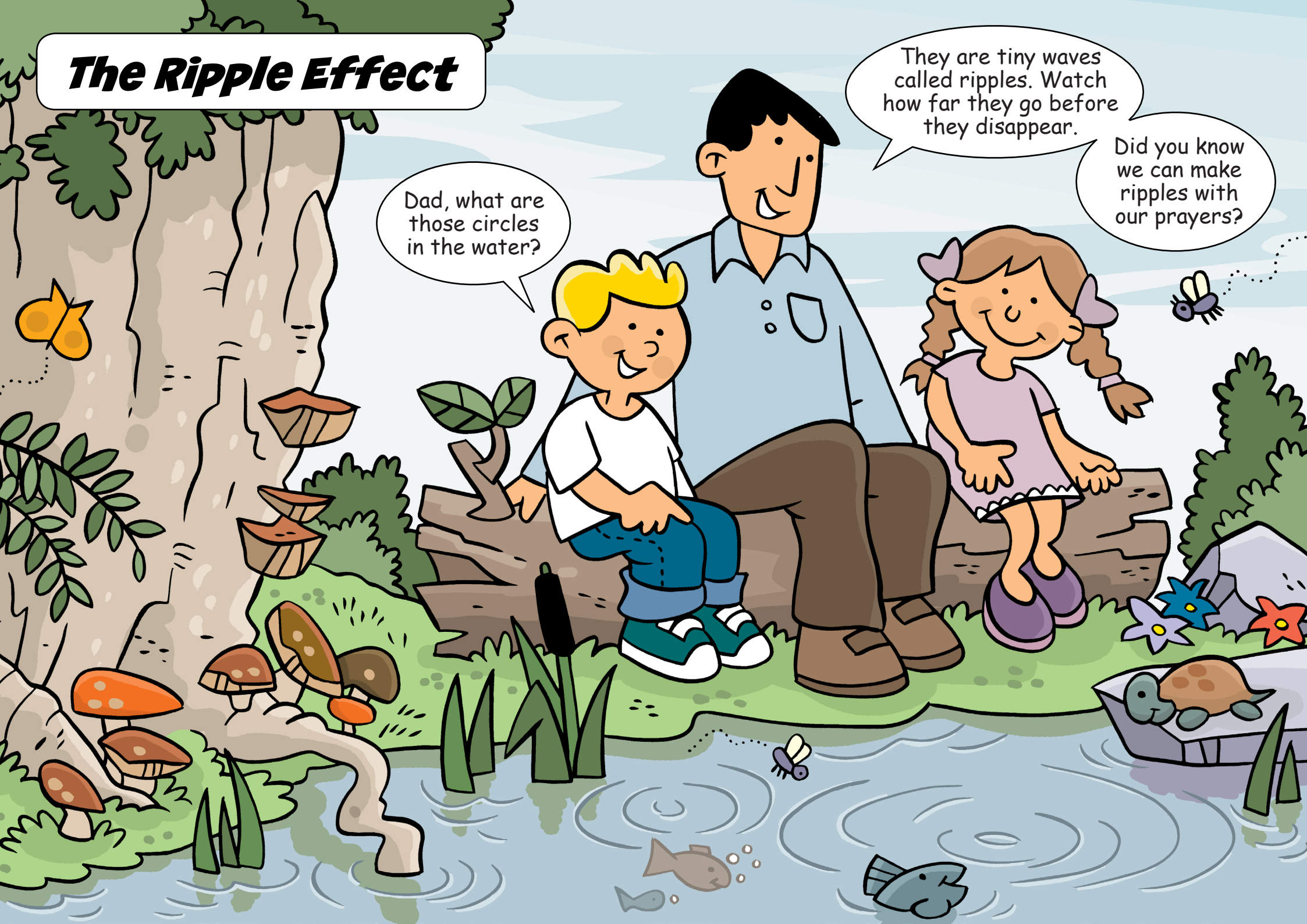


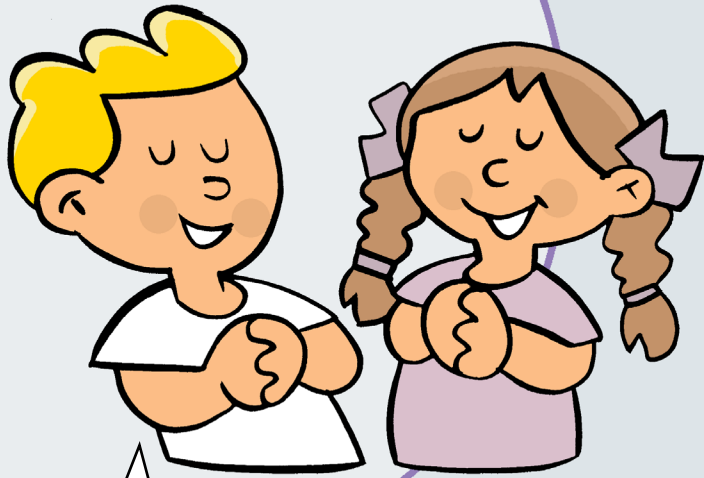
The Ripple Effect

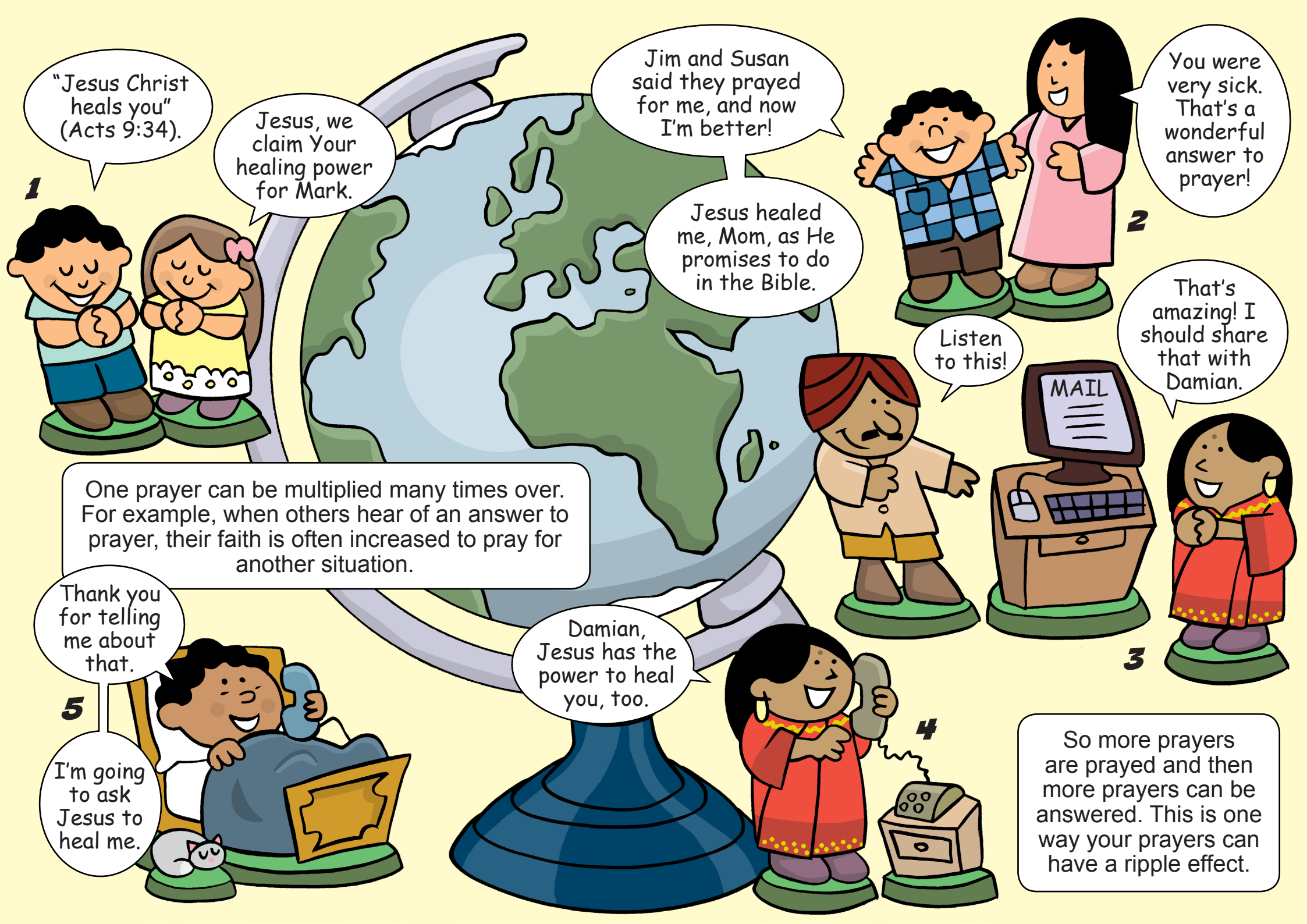
One prayer can be multiplied many times over. For example, when others hear of an answer to prayer, their faith is often increased to pray for another situation.


