
When Jesus lived on earth, He prayed for His followers: "Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth" (John 17:17 NIV).

"Sanctify" means to free someone from sin. Jesus was asking His heavenly Father to use the Word to cleanse His followers.



God's Word not only cleans your heart and mind from wrong attitudes you might encounter, but it also protects you from absorbing them.

When you read the Bible stories, you learn about God's love. When you hear something that is different from the loving truth explained in the Bible, you will know that it is wrong if you have studied the Bible.



For example, you might watch a TV show about children who disobey their parents. The Bible teaches that children should obey their parents. If you have read in the Bible where it explains that it is best for children to obey their parents, you will know that the way the children behave on the TV show is not a good example for you to follow.

The Word tells you:

"Children, always obey your parents, for this pleases the Lord" (Colossians 3:20 NLT).
