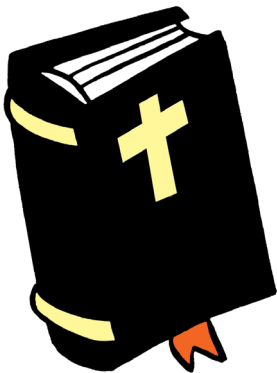




The Coin in the Mouth of a Fish
