



Water Changed to Wine

(John 2:1–11)



There was a marriage in Cana of Galilee, and Jesus' mother was there. Both Jesus and His disciples had been invited to the wedding. When they wanted more wine, Jesus' mother said to Him, "They don't have wine."

His mother then told the servants, "Do whatever He says."

There were set out six large stone water pots. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the water pots with water." And they filled them up to the brim. And he said to them, "Draw some water out now, and take it to the governor of the feast."

When the ruler of the feast had tasted the water that was turned into wine, he did not know where it was from (but the servants who drew the water knew). The ruler of the feast called the bridegroom, and said to him, "People always serve the best wine first. Then when men have drunk a lot, he serves the ordinary wine. But you have kept the good wine until now."

This was the beginning of miracles that Jesus performed. It revealed His glory, and His disciples believed on Him.
