ONE WAS GOING UP THE TRAIL.

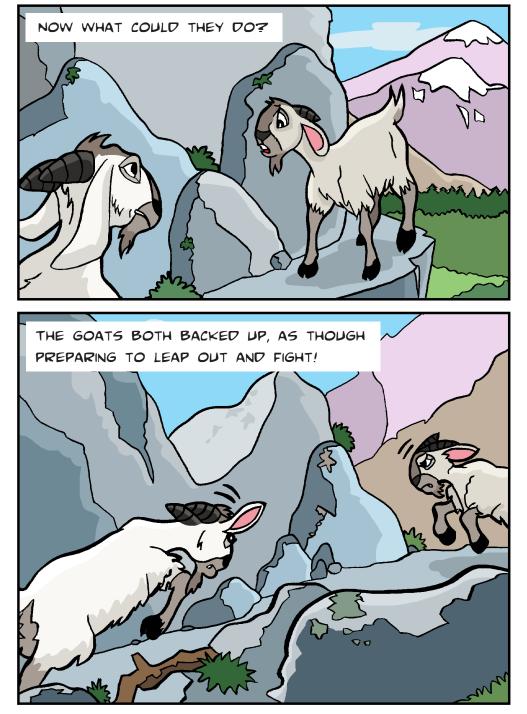
THE OTHER WAS GOING DOWN.

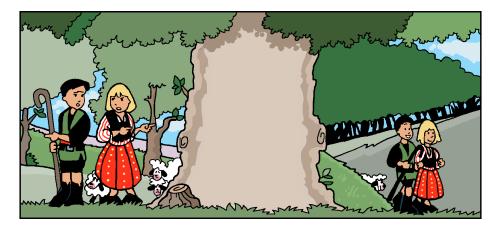


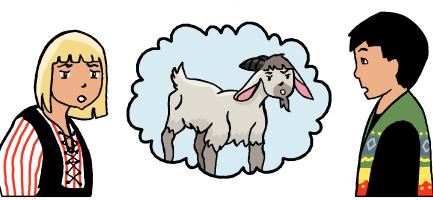


HE THEN AROSE AND CONTINUED HIS JOURNEY UP THE TRAIL.

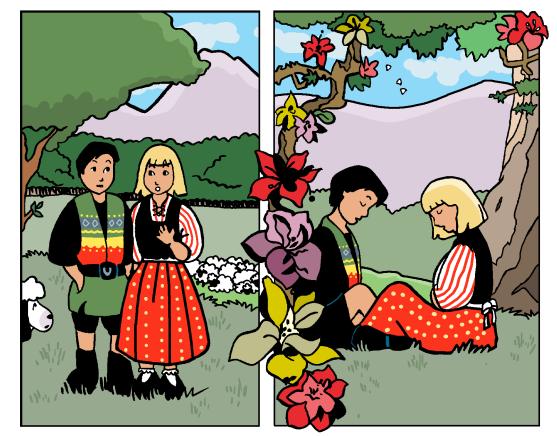
