



## The City of Jericho

When the children of Israel were first settling in the land of Canaan, Joshua sent spies to the city of Jericho. Later, the Israelites marched around the walls once every day for six days with the priests and the Ark of the Covenant leading the way. On the seventh day, they marched seven times around the walls, then the priests blew their horns, the Israelites all shouted, and the walls of the city fell.<sup>1</sup>

The city was later rebuilt during the reign of King Ahab.<sup>2</sup> It was in Jericho that Jesus met Zacchaeus many centuries later.<sup>3</sup>

The city's first biblical character link is Rahab, a woman of Jericho who hid the two spies sent by Joshua. Because of her action, God protected her household during the fall of Jericho. Rahab is honored in the book of Hebrews (in the New Testament) for her belief.<sup>4</sup> She is also listed as an ancestor of Jesus, because she was the mother of Boaz, the great grandfather of King David.<sup>5</sup>
