But then we can't ride our bikes!

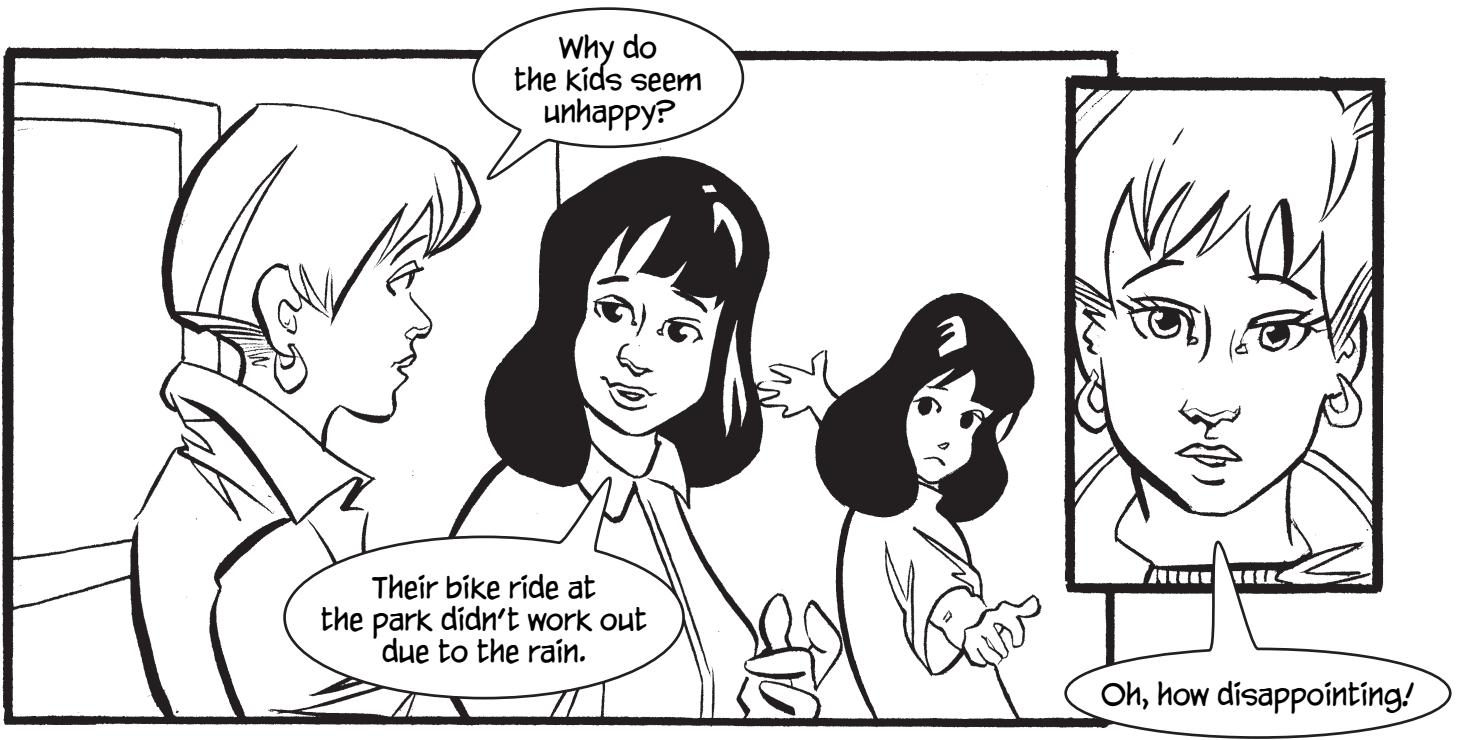
We finally have a school holiday, but now our bike ride is rained out!

It never works out!

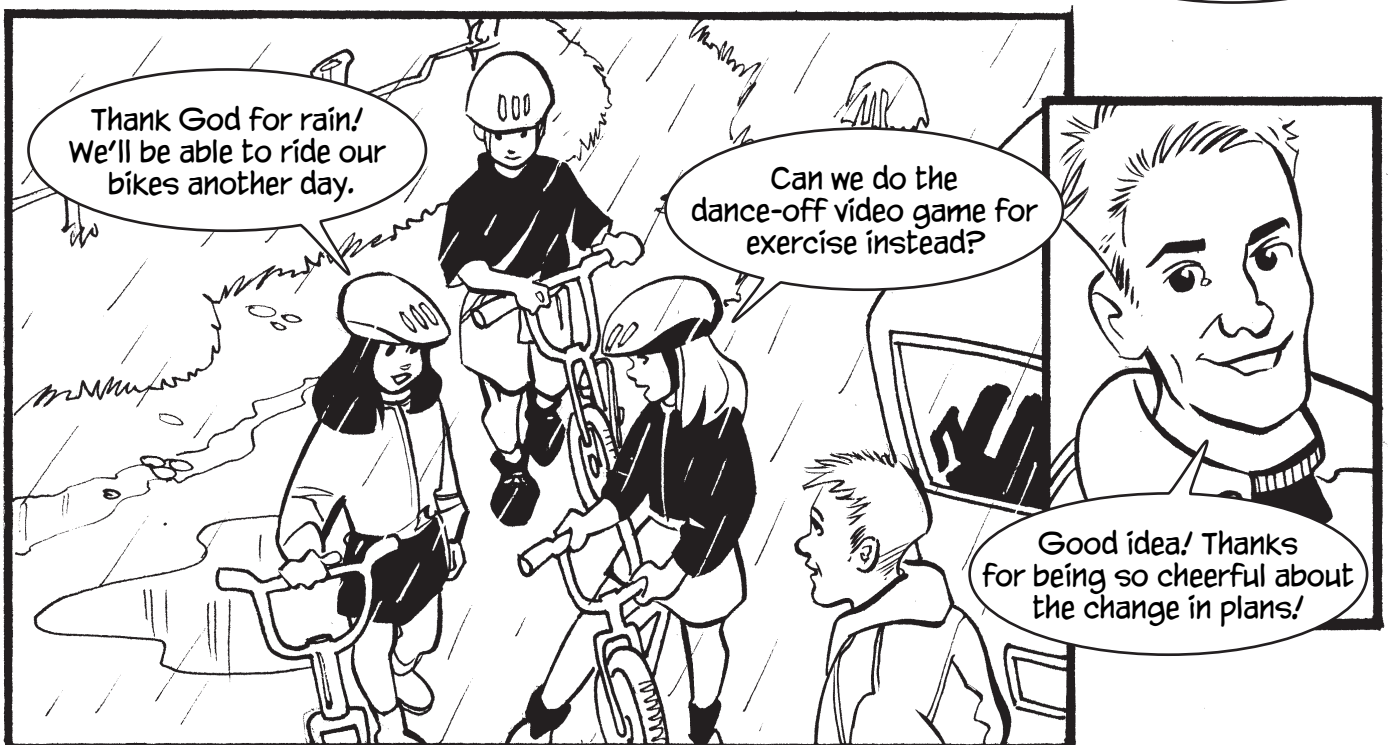
I have another idea for a fun time indoors instead.

Hi, kids!

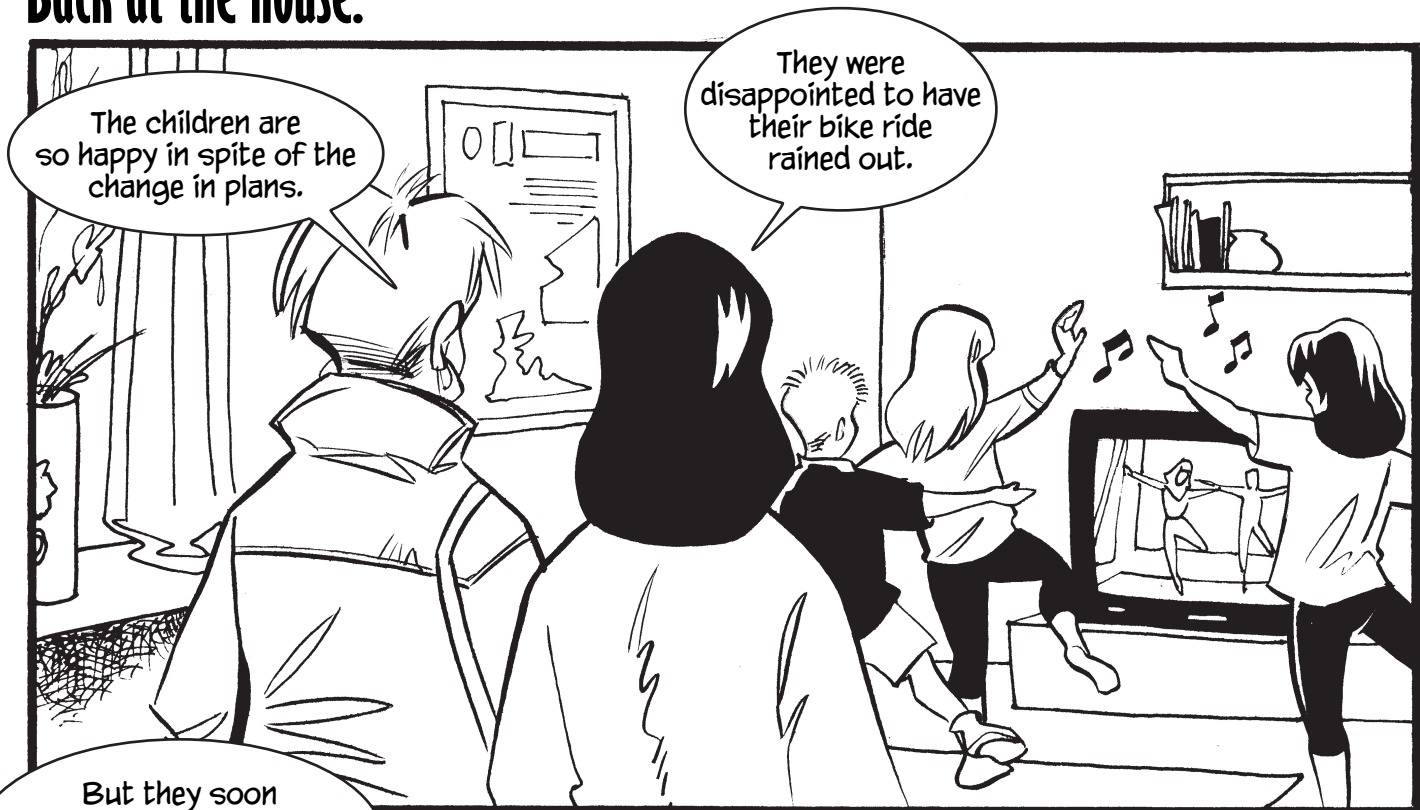




A positive example of thankfulness.

I have a friend who teaches dancing.

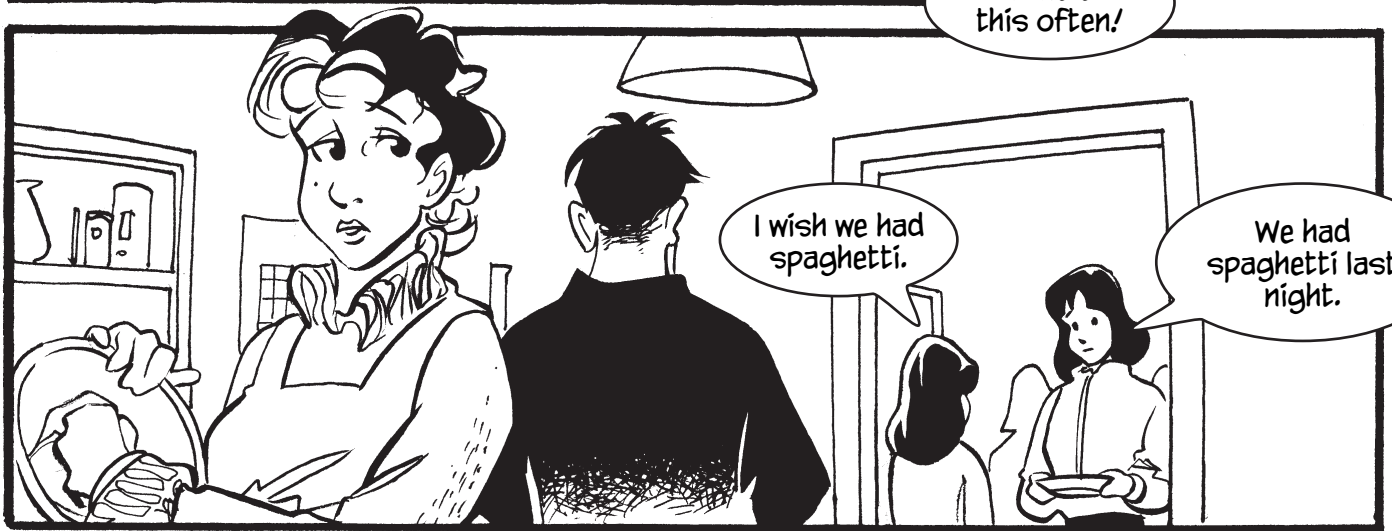
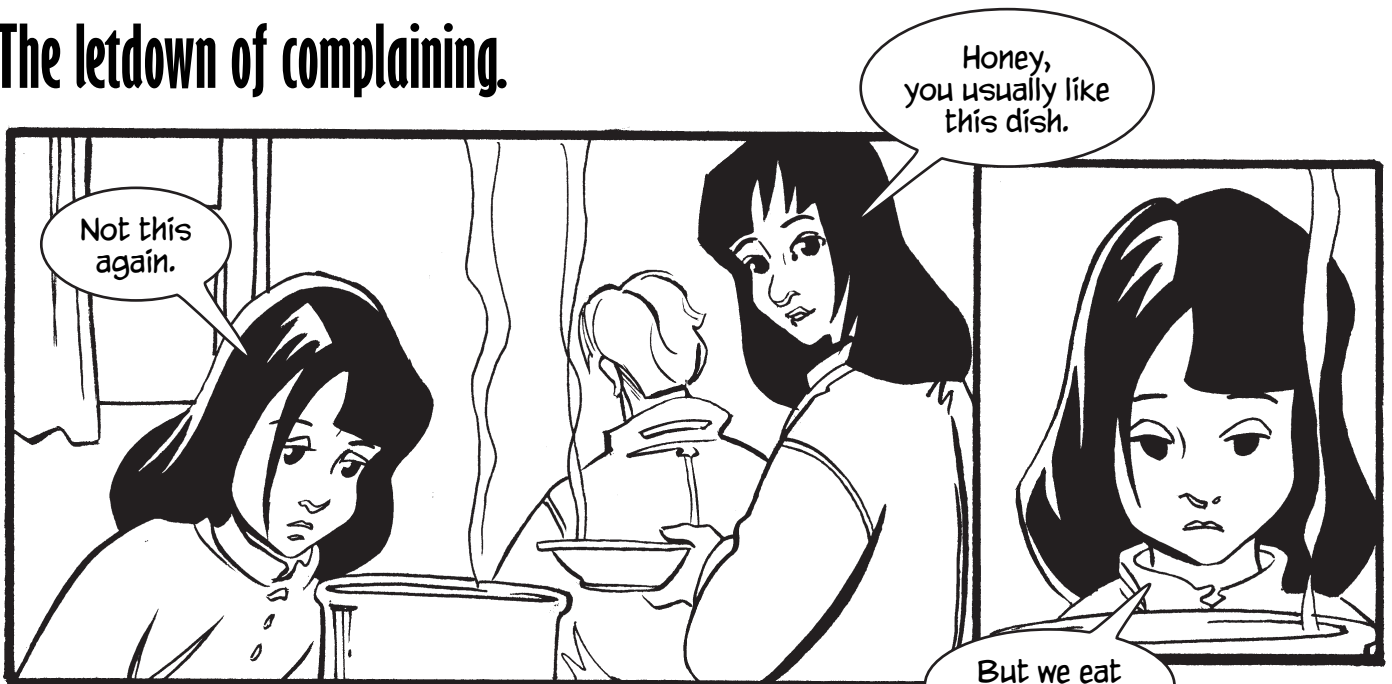
Would you be interested in going to her classes?

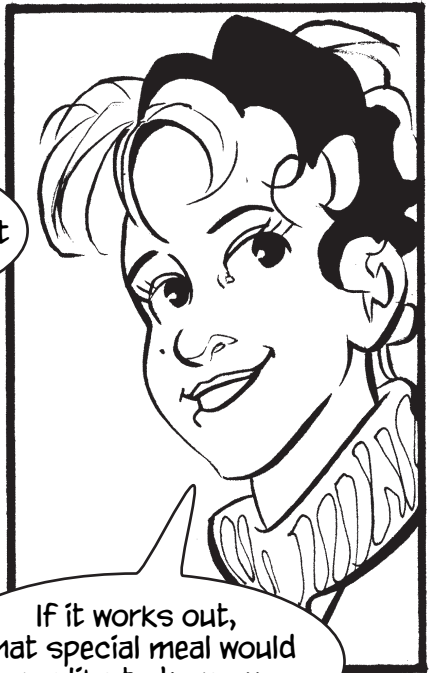
A positive example of thankfulness.



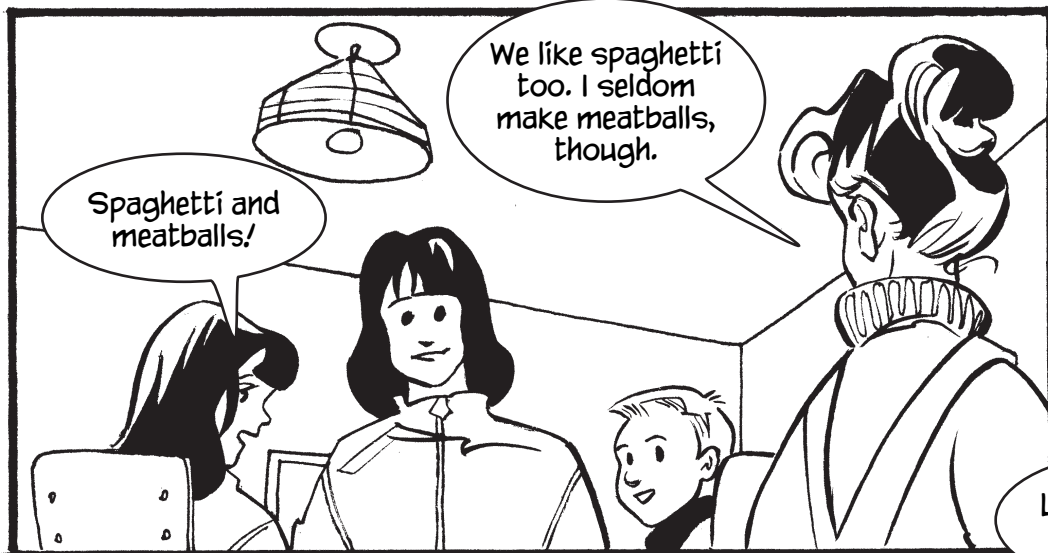
I enjoy cooking for the kids when they appreciate the meal.
