"After a long absence, upon his return, the man asked his three servants for an account of the money he had entrusted to them. The first two gave an account of how they had invested what they had received and were rewarded for it, while the third declared he was worried about losing the money so simply kept it hidden. The rich man was upset that the third servant had not wisely invested what he had been given, and he took the money away from him."
