



Name: Bread of Life

Reference: John 6:35 "Jesus said to them, 'I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst."" (ESV)

Bread gives energy to our physical bodies; without bread (or food), our bodies would die. In this verse Jesus calls Himself the "bread of life"—food for our spirits. When we believe on Him and read His Word, our spirits are energized in much the same way as our bodies are energized by eating physical food.

Name: The Door

Reference: John 10:9

"I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture." (ESV) We use doors to go from one place to the next. In John 14:6, Jesus says, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (ESV). Jesus is the door we go through to discover a relationship with God, to receive forgiveness of sins, and find eternal life.



Name: The Good Shepherd

Reference: John 10:11, 14 "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." (ESV) "I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me." (ESV)

In Psalm 23, King David describes God as a shepherd, and goes on to list the many ways that the Lord takes care of His children—just as a shepherd would.

In John 10:11, Jesus says that He is the good shepherd, and says that He will lay down His own life for them. Many of the people Jesus was talking to when He said this would have been familiar with Psalm 23 and the comparison of God being our shepherd.



Name: Jmmanuel

Reference: Matthew 1:23 "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel" (which means "God with us"). (ESV)

This name not only tells us that Jesus is God (a part of the Trinity of God), but that God, for a time, put on human form and lived a human life.



Name: King of kings and Lord of lords

Reference: Revelation 19:16 "On his robe and on his thigh he has a name written, King of kings and Lord of lords." (ESV)

Since the beginning of the world there have been countless kings, rulers, generals, and lords—today we have presidents, prime ministers, and those who sit in governments. How would you express the rank of someone who is higher than the highest king or ruler? How about King of kings and Lord of lords?
