



PROVERBS FOR KIDS: HONESTY

PROVERB: IT IS BETTER TO BE POOR AND HONEST THAN TO BE A LIAR AND A FOOL.¹

Honesty is when you speak the truth and your actions are truthful. You are honest when you tell things as they actually happened without making up a story to exaggerate what happened, make yourself sound better, or cover up something you did wrong. Your actions should also be truthful. You should not have to hide what you are doing or try to trick others.

Even when it is difficult, honesty is always the right thing to do. A small untruth is still dishonest, and it will make it easier to tell bigger untruths.
